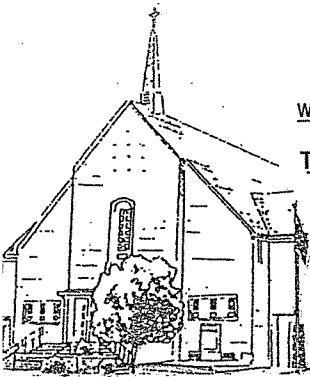

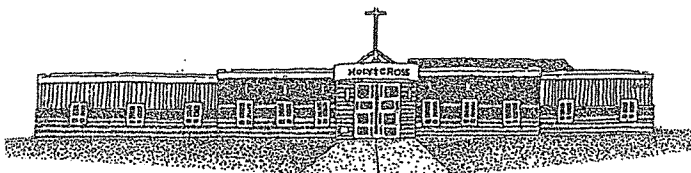

*"Today this scripture passage
is fulfilled in your hearing."*

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

You may be familiar with St. Paul's exhortation: *"Pray without ceasing"* (1 Thessalonians 5:17). It's a seemingly impossible task when we consider the myriad responsibilities that we all have day in and day out. Unless you're a cloistered nun or monk, how do you fulfill such a command? I have tried many times to be that person of constant prayer, but even for a priest this can be difficult at times. Many techniques have circulated to help us inch closer to being that person of constant prayer.

Dr. Taylor Marshall is a Catholic lay theologian that lives in Dallas, Texas with his wife and seven children. His work involves teaching people about the theology and philosophy of St. Thomas Aquinas (who lived in the 13th century and whose thought forms the basis of much of our understanding of our faith, especially the Sacraments). In 2013 Dr. Marshall began the New Saint Thomas Institute (<http://newsaintthomas.com>), which provides online theology and philosophy classes to people around the world.

Dr. Marshall recently wrote an article entitled *"8 Tips on How to Pray Every Day"* that I want to share with you today (for the original, visit <http://taylormarshall.com/?s=8+tips>). I think he gives some wonderful insights into how to fulfill St. Paul's desire for us:

In our Catholic New Year's Goals webinar, we covered many tips on how to elevate your daily spiritual life. The single best thing that you can do is to *commit to a schedule of daily mental prayer*. Here are tips in no particular order:

- 1) Find a place in your home where you pray. Designate a space.
- 2) Find a time in the day when you pray. The prophets and the saints usually got up early to pray. Set your alarm clock earlier (go to bed earlier) and wake up to be with Christ in the morning.
- 3) Create a morning ritual that includes prayer. I recommend that it include Scriptural reading also. The Bible is how God usually talks to you. "God never talks to me," people often say. My response is, "Are you reading the Bible?" God talks to you in Scripture.
- 4) Use a timer on your phone. Start at 5 minutes and work up to 30 minutes daily.
- 5) Mental prayer is using your mind ("mental") to speak to God. Tell him everything. Speak with your heart. Ask Him questions about your life. Ask Him theology questions. Ask Him to do more than you expect. Don't be afraid to ask for insanely crazy requests. He likes to answer those best because they prove that we didn't accomplish it.
- 6) Keep a New Testament or spiritual reading book nearby. If your mind loses track and wanders, use this book to read a few sentences to focus again on Christ or spiritual thoughts.
- 7) Use your daily time to fill yourself with positivity. The people that I know that pray 30-60 minutes every day are very positive thinkers. Why? Because they spend time with God and learn that all things are possible through Christ. Faith and prayer build confidence and a "get it done" attitude. The most pessimistic (and lazy) people are the people who do not pray or do not spend time alone in silence. *"Be still and know that I am God"* (Psalm 46:10).
- 8) Make daily prayer your identity. Repeatedly tell yourself: "I am a person who talks to the Trinity every day. That is who I am and I always do it." Become what you are.

I hope Dr. Marshall's tips give you some ideas on how you can improve your discipline of prayer, especially as we prepare in a few weeks to enter into the Lenten season. May your prayer be fruitful, may it bless you, and may it gain for you a richer and deeper relationship with our Lord!

PREPARING BEFORE LENT BEGINS

Taking some time to get ready for Lent will ensure that we aren't going to miss the first week or two of Lent, because we are just getting started. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, but we want to be ready to really take off on that day, rather than just beginning to think about Lent on that day. Part of what makes a vacation or a special anniversary so special is the build-up to it.

It doesn't take a lot of time to prepare for the beginning of Lent. It just takes desire and focus. God can do so much with that. We can give God more of a space to touch our hearts if we begin to establish some simple patterns. We could wake up each morning, and stand by the edge of our beds, and ask the Lord for the grace to let this day be one in which I long for the beginning of Lent. Perhaps we need to ask for specific helps or graces to get ready to begin Lent. Whatever we try to say, our Lord can understand the Spirit trying to speak through our simple words. And all it takes is the time to find and put on our slippers. And each night, in the days ahead, we can practice giving thanks to God before going to bed. This simple pattern, in the morning and evening can stir our spirits to look forward to and prepare for Lent, as a season of grace.

May our Lord bless us all on this journey ahead.

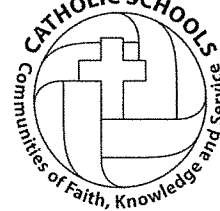


